

Located on traditional Musqueam land, the UBC Museum of Anthropology is renowned for its international collections, innovative exhibitions, and spectacular west coast setting.

Now, as we celebrate our 30th year in one of Arthur Erickson's signature buildings, we are embarking upon a major expansion, increasing our size by 50% by 2009, and creating unprecedented opportunities for research, teaching, and public enjoyment. This multi-million dollar project, developed in consultation with local First Nations and the UBC Laboratory of Archaeology, includes the creation of the Reciprocal Research Network (RRN). This virtual conduit for the exchange of collections information is being co-developed by the Museum and the Musqueam Indian Band, Sto:lo Nation, and U'mista Cultural Society.

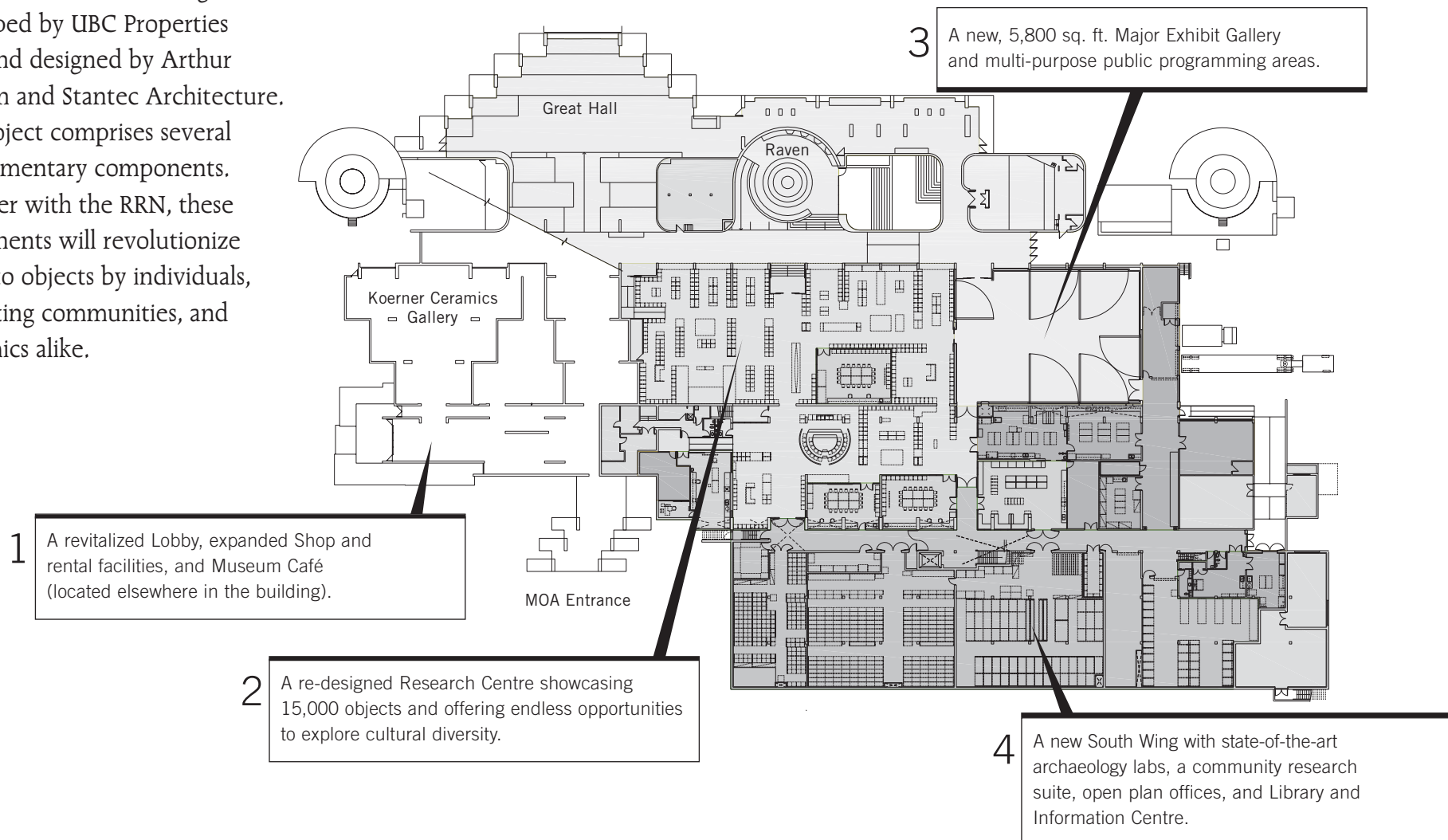
